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How are members selected/invited to join your committee?

GEC-ESTRO has a document that describes the structure and organisation of our committee, which states that the maximum number of members is 12, in keeping with the ESTRO statutes. Dedicated members are the chair, past chair, chair-elect, our secretary and the working-group chairs, which sums to 11 representatives. Additionally, we have an independent member; the incumbent is currently in his second term. Moreover, we are happy that we have Cyrus Chargari as observer representative of young ESTRO on our team.

What is the profile of the perfect candidate for your committee or working groups?

Currently, there is no written profile. However, the perfect candidate of course would be someone who was interested broadly in the different aspects of brachytherapy and willing to take an active role in supporting interests that GEC-ESTRO, ESTRO, and young ESTRO have in common, such as educational issues.
